

Unprecedented Major Projects Investment Pipeline briefings generate support







The Illawarra region has an unprecedented level of transformative major projects/ infrastructure planned in the next 20 years.

Our analysis indicates we have a \$33 billion pipeline of major projects which is great news for jobs and growth. The projects are in the areas of renewable energy, advanced manufacturing, transport, health and commercial construction.

During this quarter, we have provided briefings and been encouraged by our stakeholders to continue working on finding solutions to the challenges of delivering these projects, especially the skilled construction workers required. We will need an additional 2,800 workers by January 2024, and up to 4,250 workers in 2029.

2 year Skill Shortages research project launched



With growing demand for skilled workers in the Illawarra region, RDA Illawarra has invested in a two-year research program to deliver timely skills demand data at a local level.

The first Skilled Worker Demand Survey is **Open Now** with responses being taken by research partner EMRS by phone and online.


Findings from in-depth interviews with ten key industry bodies and regional employers revealed the following:

- There is an opportunity for more engagement with TAFE and UOW
- Workers moving into the region have high salary expectations
- There is a lack of affordable or available housing
- Illawarra labour market conditions are closely aligned to the Sydney market
- Lack of labour is creating constraints on major project delivery
- Heavy industry trades require specialised experience - importing trades from light manufacturing is not a ready-made solution
- The Illawarra lifestyle is a key attraction.

Defence advocacy and investment attraction activities gain momentum







Defence industry and investment attraction has been a key activity for RDA Illawarra during the last quarter.

Two strategies have been released, a major conference held and there is a significant opportunity for Illawarra businesses to gain a share of the \$32 billion defence industry spending.

RDA Illawarra contributed to the 10year Defence Strategy by KPMG, recently launched by Business Illawarra.

The <u>Defence Strategic Review</u> was launched by the Australian Government.

RDA Illawarra welcomes the release of both Strategies and we look forward to continuing to work on Defence initiatives and advocacy, as we have done for the past decade.


