RDA Illawarra's November Housing Supply Roundtable highlighted both the social and economic effects of the housing shortage in the region. With over \$30 billion in transformative infrastructure planned for completion over the next two decades, just housing the peak construction workforce of more than 4,000 will be a challenge.

Keynote speakers emphasised the social impact of transient accommodation and the potential economic impact to the region of not being able to attract and retain skilled workers.

Possible solutions and actions were brainstormed and will form the foundation for RDA Illawarra's advocacy with NSW and Australian governments.





Australia's future.


Submissions for local government included the Kiama Regional Economic Development Strategy and Wollongong Retail and Business Strategy.











Advocacy ramps up and positive feedback received for Illawarra-Shoalhaven Greater Cities Partnership

The dialogue has been opened up with State and Federal Governments since the launch of the <u>Illawarra-Shoalhaven</u> <u>Greater Cities Partnership</u> in October with a significant number of briefings held. We look forward to working across all levels of government and the private sector to secure funding for the transformation of our regions.

Peter Poulos (NSW Parliamentary Secretary for Wollongong and the Illawarra) is very supportive of the updated City Partnership, noting that the projects are well selected for the region. At a recent meeting, he made a number of suggestions regarding advocacy and offered his assistance to make it happen at a State level.

Record number of applications for Leadership Illawarra Program 2023-2024



A record thirty-five applications were received for the 2023-24 intake of the <u>Leadership</u> Illawarra Program.

28 successful applicants will commence the two-year experiential leadership program in February.

Five scholarships were awarded to a group of high calibre next generation Illawarra leaders from the highly competitive field of applicants.

The incoming cohort will soon dive into a range of leadership workshops, UOW Masterclasses, Site visits, Mentoring and networking opportunities.
